*2024 Inductees to the Stratford-Perth
Museum Agriculture Wall of Fame*

At a ceremony this past spring, a local dairy farming couple from Atwood, Dr. Karen Galbraith & Steve Dolson, were inducted into the Stratford-Perth Museum 2024 Agriculture Wall of Fame.

The couple's master breeder registered Holstein herd, known as Legacy Holsteins, has been one of the top producing and highly-classified herds in Perth County for many years. Both Karen and Steve have helped lead a number of community organizations over many decades in their young careers.

Karen was a founding member and past president of Perth Care for Kids and a board member of Elma Mutual Insurance (which later became Trillium Mutual Insurance in Listowel). She has been active with Big Brothers Big Sisters as an active Big Sister, a 4-H leader and also a leader on her local church board. She was also heavily involved with the dairy portion of the 2013 International Plowing Match and has spent many years organizing the ice cream booth at the Listowel Fair. Earning a M.Sc. from the University of Guelph in capacity and rural development, she spent some time living and working in inner Mongolia helping small landholders to help improve their milk quality. In 2014, Karen became an inaugural director and is still active on the Kenyan Kids Foundation Canada.

Steve has been an active and valued member of the Perth County Holstein Club, is a past 4-H leader and is currently an Ontario 4-H Foundation trustee. He is a past president of United Breeders and was involved with the process of forming the Semex Alliance. Steve is also a past member and chairman of the board of Gay Lea Foods. In the past, Steve was awarded the distinguished certificate of recognition from Holstein Canada for his valuable contribution to the Canadian dairy industry. Locally, he has been involved in the Listowel Agricultural Society for many years taking on many leadership roles, including President in 1993 & 1994. Along with Karen, Steve is involved with Kenyan Kids Foundation and has also been an active participant in dairy extension work in Kenya. Steve is also the current chairperson of the Ontario Agri-Food Discovery Centre.

The Listowel Agricultural Society want to thank Steve & Karen for their contribution, not only to the agriculture industry, but to our local community. It is our honour to have them opening the 168th Listowel Agricultural Fair!

Listowel Fair Tractor Pull Rules

1. Pullers must obey Officials and Pullers Association. Their decision is final. Violation of rules or arguing with Officials or Association shall constitute a disqualification.
2. Pull is over when forward motion has ended. All tractors must stop immediately upon signal from Official.
3. Tractor must be in neutral while being hooked and un-hooked.
4. Consumption of alcohol in track area or prior to pulling is cause for disqualification.
5. No helpers allowed on track or tractor during a pull. Driver must be seated during a pull and in complete control of tractor at all times. Tractors operated in an unsafe manner shall be disqualified at Official's discretion.
6. All drivers must be 16 years of age or older and **MUST** be wearing a DOT certified helmet with a chin strap.
7. All weights must be securely fastened. No chaining of weights. Tractor with weights behind axel must have **"wheelie bars"**.
8. No 3-point hitch weights are allowed.
9. All tractors must pass through inspection prior to pulling.
10. The first competitor of each class may choose to hook again and pull in the 3rd pulling position and the first pull will no be counted, unless disqualified in that class. The decision to pull again must be made before tractor is unhitched from sled by informing track officials.
11. Maximum drawbar length is 18 inches from center of rear axle to point of hook. Maximum draw bar height is 20 inches from ground to point of hook. Drawbar must be stationary in all directions. Sled must hook directly into hitching device. Hook must drop completely into hitching device or a clevis shall be added.
12. Any tractor dropping weights or parts on the track shall be disqualified.
13. Antique and Open pulls are considered **ONE** complete event. **ONLY 2** classes per tractor for entire day. The same tractor cannot pull in the same class with different drivers.
14. Tractors may **NOT** have added accessories for weights (blade, water tanks, loader arms, etc.)
15. Tractors that leave track will be red flagged at point they contact track boundaries and measurement will be taken.
16. All contestants **PULL AT OWN RISK** and must sign a waiver prior to pulling.
17. Pullers have 2 tries to get 75' down the track. If the puller does not make it to 75', the puller is disqualified.
18. Duals are **ONLY** allowed in the 22,000lbs., 28,000lbs., 36,000lbs. and 46,000lbs. classes.
19. 4-Wheel drive **ONLY** allowed in 15,500lbs., 17,500lbs., 22,000lbs., 28,000lbs., 36,000lbs. and 46,000lbs. classes.
20. If you do not have a clevis or equivalent when you pull in front of the sled to pull, you will be disqualified with **NO REFUND**.
21. Helmets **MUST** be worn by **ALL PULLERS. NO EXCEPTIONS**. Failure to wear a DOT certified helmet with chin strap will result in disqualification.
22. Registration for a class is closed at puller #5 of the previous class.
23. Adjustable height hitches (European) **MUST** be locked in place to pull.

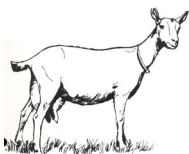

HELPFUL HINTS FOR PREPARING MATERIALS

(Ontario Judging Standards for Horticultural & Floral Design)

1. Cut flowers and foliage the evening before the show or in the early morning.
2. Flowers stay fresher and show better if there are NO LEAVES in the container.
3. Make a fresh slanting cut at the end of stems, for maximum water intake.
4. Place in a wide bucket in deep *warm water*, preferably overnight.
5. Store in a dark, humid, draft-free place.
6. Some cut flowers, foliage and woody materials do not readily absorb water and require further treatment to prevent wilting. Woody branches may benefit from splitting cut ends and some need the thick outer layer removed as well. Some cut flowers (e.g., poppies) benefit from burning the stem ends while others benefit by placing stem ends in boiling water or from chemicals in the water. About 2 Tbsp. of glycerine in 4 L of water, or florist crystals may be beneficial. Details are also available in flower arranging books.
7. Removal of dust, stains, and any other foreign material from blooms and foliage enhances the exhibit.
8. Remove damaged foliage.
9. Re-cut stem ends before placing in show containers.

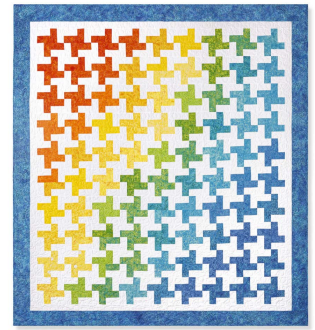

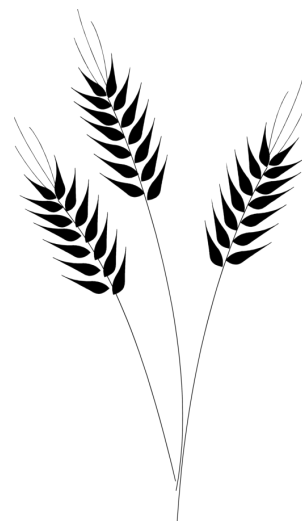

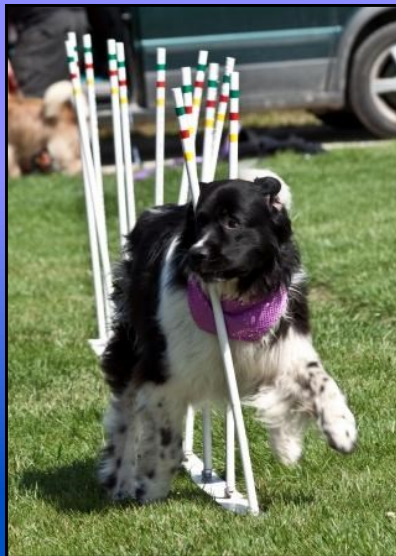

DEMOLITION DERBY RULES

1. Drivers must be 16 years old and have a valid Ontario drivers licence.
2. Open to any two wheel drive North American or import car. No Chrysler Imperials, no convertibles, no station wagons, no limousines (small hatchbacks accepted). No awd cars converted to 2wd.
3. All cars are to be stock. No bumper swaps, no bumpers added, no engine swaps, no engine or rad relocation, no modifications to engine, transmission or rad mounts period.
4. Differentials may be welded, a drivers seat support may be added. Fuel injected cars require a fuel pump kill switch on the top centre of dash or roof.
5. All glass, lights, trim, interior panels, carpeting and headliner must be removed. Dash panel and drivers seat and seatbelt should remain (seatbelt must function). Windshield can remain. Holes in fire wall must be covered. If windshield is removed a 2" steel pipe, square tube or angle iron 1/8" minimum needs to be place from roof to cowl in front of driver in windshield opening and securely fastened. Drivers plate may be added to drivers door only and can only be attached to the drivers door and can not extend more than 4" past the length of the door at either end and can't be more than 12" high or 3/8" thick and must be flat plate. Cross bar may be added behind drivers seat pillar to pillar and not connected to frame.
6. All airbags must be removed (not just cut) REMOVED.
7. Fuel tank is to be moved to the rear seat area and security fastened. Small fuel cell or marine tank is preferred.
8. Battery is to be moved to the front passenger area and securely fastened preferably in a container in case of explosion. Only one automotive battery allowed.
9. All rads, condensers, coolers and fans must be stock or can be removed. (Nothing can be relocated or added).
10. All antifreeze and refrigerant must be removed. (Water in rads only).
11. Doors and trunk must be secured shut with wire, chain, seat belt or 3" maximum bead of weld opposite to each hinge. (No threaded rod or bolts through floor or frame).
12. Hood to be secured in similar way as trunk and must have a 12" minimum hole cut over the engine in case of need for fire extinguishing. Must open for tech inspection.
13. Tires and rims must be stock or the same size and load range as was available on the vehicle new, mini spares are allowed. All wheel weights must be removed.
14. No modifications to any of the suspension allowed. Coil springs may be wired to axle mount. Must have functioning brakes.
15. Previously demoed car are allowed but they must adhere to our rules. Any repairs will be strictly judged.
16. Drivers must wear work boots, coveralls (or at least long pants and long sleeve shirt) fire retardant preferred and a DOT/ SFI approved helmet with face shield or safety glasses with side shields. All drivers must have a medium-size fire extinguisher mounted within reach.
17. Drivers doors need to be painted white on black or coloured cars and black on white cars.
18. Cars will need to arrive ready for tech. **TECH ENDS HALF AN HOUR BEFORE SHOW TIME. LATE ARRIVALS WILL BE TURNED AWAY AND ENTRY FEE MAY NOT BE REFUNDED.**
19. Premises will be policed for illegal use of drugs or alcohol.

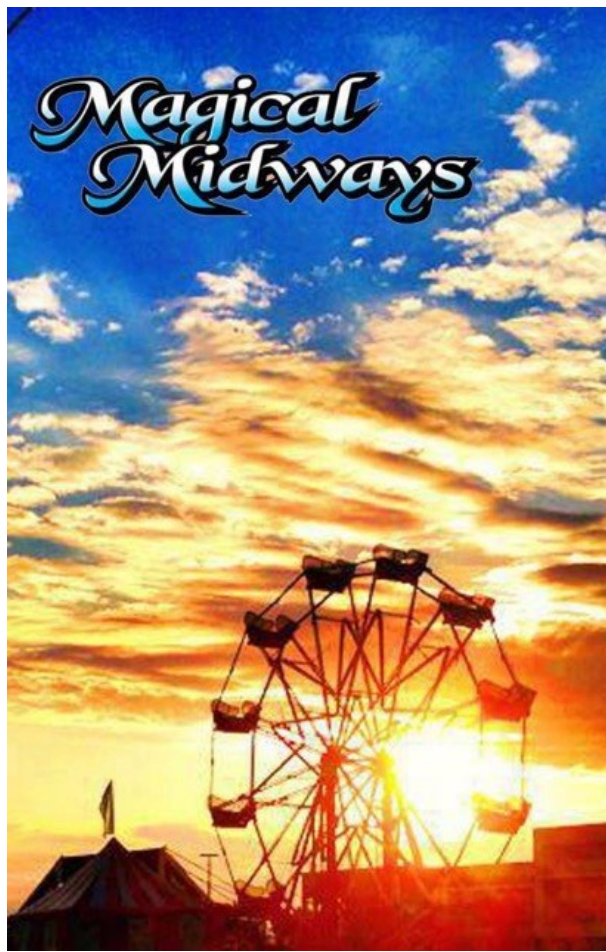
